1 PART	STRAWBERRIES & 'CREAM' SYRUP
3 PARTS	Moët & Chandon Champagne

JUICE STRAWBERRIES AND SEASON, ADDING LAYERS OF BODY TO CREATE THE SENSATION OF CREAMINESS WITHOUT COW. COMBINE WITH COGNAC AND TOP GENEROUSLY WITH CHAMPAGNE, POURING INTO A CAKE MOULD AND CROWNING WITH PORNSTAR FROSTING.
